Zeon awarded the highest rating of Supplier Engagement Leader for the first time, after the CDP's Supplier Engagement Assessment

Zeon Corporation (Zeon; head office: Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo; President and CEO: Tetsuya Toyoshima) has been named a Supplier Engagement Leader in the Supplier Engagement Assessment (SEA)*¹ 2025 conducted by the CDP*², an international environmental nonprofit organization headquartered in the United Kingdom. This marks the first time Zeon has received this top SEA rating.



The SEA evaluates how companies address climate change across their supply chains, based on responses to the CDP Climate Change Questionnaire in five key areas: governance, targets, Scope 3 emissions, risk management, and supplier engagement.

Zeon received the highest rating in the latest assessment in recognition of its efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions through collaboration with suppliers, an initiative promoted across the Zeon Group, as well as its ongoing dialogue with suppliers through procurement activities.

Guided by its corporate philosophy of “Contributing to the preservation of the Earth and the prosperity of the human race,” Zeon is committed to sustainable management. Looking ahead, it will continue to work with stakeholders, including suppliers, to address social challenges such as climate change and strive to be a company that lives up to societal expectations.

*1 Supplier Engagement Assessment (SEA): A rating system that evaluates companies responding to the CDP’s climate change questionnaire, with a focus on how they address climate change across their supply chains and engage with suppliers. Of the approximately 22,100 companies that disclosed information through the CDP in 2025, 1,965 companies were recognized as Supplier Engagement Leaders, the highest rating.

*2 CDP: The Carbon Disclosure Project is an international environmental nonprofit organization, founded in the United Kingdom in 2000. The CDP operates a disclosure system that enables companies and local governments to access, manage, and disclose their environmental impacts. CDP scores are widely used by investors and companies as an international benchmark for decision-making. In 2025, more than 22,100 companies disclosed environmental data through the CDP.
